Advisory: COVID Prevention & Management

Looking into the recent rise of COVID Positive cases across Surat city, other parts of country and other nations, the following Advisory is being issued by Health Centre SVNIT in consultation with Medical Advisory Committee to safe guard ourselves and others too. All are advised to follow strictly.

- 1. All the students must wear face mask while moving around in the hostels, campus and also while attending classes. All the concerned class teachers are hereby requested to adhere with this advisory and do not allow any student inside the class room without mask.
- Avoid mass gathering of students before and after OFFLINE classes in the Departments. All the concerned Head / Co-ordinators / Lab. In charges of the Departments are requested to instruct the students accordingly.
- 3. Avoid mass gathering of students inside and nearby hostels. All the concerned Chief Wardens of the hostels are requested to instruct their concerned Supervisors / Security Staff of the hostels to follow this instruction strictly.
- Regular Health Survey of all the hostel inmates are advised to be conducted in all the hostels. Please consult MO - Dr. Neha Sharma / CMO - Dr. S. G. Shah / Health Centre immediately, if suffering from Fever / any other COVID related symptoms.
- 5. All the students must follow COVID protocol and no student should leave the campus if found COVID positive without the permission of Medical Officer/ Chief Medical Officer / Chairman Taskforce. Medical rooms are currently available to take care of COVID Positive cases and students should not panic. Violating COVID protocol may lead to face the consequences out of it and he/she will be solely responsible.
- 6. All the residents of campus are hereby informed that in case of any COVID POSITIVE case must be reported immediately on phone to MO Dr. Neha Sharma (WhatsApp No.9596932829 / CMO Dr. S. G. Shah (WhatsApp No. 9924133525). Please consult MO Dr. Neha Sharma / CMO, Dr. S. G. Shah immediately if suffering from Fever / any other COVID related symptoms.
- 7. In case of any COVID Positive case of resident of campus, his / her family members are advised to undergo Rapid Antigen Test immediately and follow the COVID Protocol as per SMC Guidelines. They are advised not to come in contact with other residents and may leave their home only under Medical Emergency duly permitted by MO / CMO.
- 8. Kindly Follow other COVID Appropriate Behaviour norms like Social Distancing, Cough Hygiene, Sanitizing / Washing hands regularly and take measures to boost up your immunity.

Advisory: Malaria – Dengue, Typhoid & Jaundice Fever Prevention & Management

Looking into the Past Experience of rise of Malaria, Dengue, Typhoid and Jaundice cases during Monsoon at SVNIT Campus and in and around Surat city the following Advisory is being issued by Health

Centre SVNIT in consultation with Medical Advisory Committee to safe guard ourselves and others too. All are advised to follow strictly.

For Malaria & Dengue Prevention:

- 1. Avoid mosquito bites by wearing light colored full sleeved clothes.
- 2. Do not move around on lawns in the morning and evening hours. Also keep the doors and windows closed during this time.
- 3. Use personal mosquito repellant devices in your rooms. Mosquito nets are recommended and safe.
- 4. Report the cases of water-logging to Supervisors so that immediate action will be initiated to prevent mosquito breeding in and around hostels.
- 5. Report to Health Centre, SVNIT when sudden high fever with chills, vomiting, headache, muscle pains & weakness symptoms are present.

For Typhoid & Jaundice Cases: 🔥

- 1. Use Drinking water from one reliable source having water purifier.
- 2. Avoid eating outside food prepared in unhygienic conditions.
- 3. Wash your hands thoroughly and frequently.
- 4. Report to Health Centre in case you have High Fever, Abdominal Pain, Loss of Appetite, Dark Yellow Colored Urine, Nausea-Vomiting etc.

Do not create panic situation when blood report shows Positive for Typhoid / Jaundice / Malaria / Dengue or (Low Platelet Counts having suspicion of Dengue fever)

Take the guidance from MO - Dr. Neha Sharma (WhatsApp No.9596932829) / CMO - Dr. S. G. Shah (WhatsApp No. 9924133525) at Health Centre, SVNIT. If hospitalization is necessary then the doctors will advise accordingly.

Regarding Mediclaim procedures please take advice from the concerned clerk of Office of Dean (SW).

All are requested to extend their full support & co-operation. Please note that by violating the COVID protocol may invite in increase of more COVID POSITIVE cases and may need to face the consequences out of it.
